There are many signs and symptoms leading up to a Heart Attack, According to the American Heart Association, here are 5 major warning signs to get you started:

- Pain or discomfort in the chest
- 2. Lightheadedness, nausea, or vomiting
- 3. Jaw, neck or back pain
- 4. Discomfort or pain in arm or shoulder
- 5. Shortness of breath



Lesson/Activity:

Go back to the second article in the bell ringer <u>Heart</u> <u>Foundation: First steps for recovery</u> and write down in your notebook or on a sheet of paper the six steps outlined to help you recover from a cardiac issue.



Six Steps to Cardiac Recovery

- 1. Starting a routine
- 2. What you can do
- 3. Take your medicines
- 4. See your doctor regularly
- 5. Care for your wounds
- 6. Keep up your cardiac rehabilitation



Practice:

Create a brochure for a group of elementary students that would help them identify if there grandparent may be having a heart attack and what they can do to help if ever put in that situation. This should not be scary but helpful and informative, assuring them that they can help in this type of emergency situation.
