#### **Objective/Learning Target:**

Students will be able to: identify and describe the proper techniques when using (PPE) Personal Protective Equipment in lab settings. (Reference: PLTW<sup>®</sup> 5.1.3 Isolating Bacteria)

## Lesson/Activity:

PPE is used in many Biomedical Fields but according to the stats most are used in the medical field. So we are going to start by watching the following video <a href="Donning and Removing PPE">Donning and Doffing PPE: Gown, Gloves, Mask, Respirator, Goggles</a> While you are watching this video take notes over the key points (they label these in the video) in your notebook / lab journal or seperate piece of paper.



## **Key Points to Remember:**

- -Put on PPE before entering the patient's room.
- -Keep hands away from face, and don't touch PPE.
- -Avoid touching areas in the patient's room.
- -Remove PPE at patient's doorway or outside of the room, and perform hand hygiene immediately.
- -Remove the respirator outside of room AFTER closing the patient's door.
- -If hands become contaminated during PPE removal, stop and perform hand hygiene, and then proceed with PPE removal.

#### Order for Doffing (Removing) PPE:

- -Gloves
- -Goggles or Face Shield
- -Gown
- -Mask or Respirator
- -Perform Hand Hygiene
- \*If hands become soiled at any time while removing an article of PPE, stop and perform hand hygiene. Then, continue with PPE removal.

### **Respirator Tips:**

- 1. Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- 2. Perform an annual "mask fit test" with your employer.
- 3. After donning your mask, perform a seal check to ensure a proper seal and fit.

## **Contaminated Areas:**

- -Outside of gloves
- -Front of the gown
- -Gown's sleeves
- -Front of face shield / goggles
- -Front of mask or respirator



### **Answers continued:**

# Clean Areas:

- -Inside of gloves
- -Back of the gown
- -Gown's ties
- -Straps of face shield / goggles
- -Straps of mask or respirator
