Lesson Objective:

Students will create backgrounds for characters.

Bell Ringer:

Lesson Steps:

Many times, the writer will indicate some background information in character descriptions or dialogue. But sometimes, much needed information is not mentioned. It is imperative for an actor to create background for the character. With adding background, you are making your character much more dimensional and interesting. Again, if the playwright doesn't include certain aspects about the characters, you must create them. Make certain that anything you create is consistent with the character and what information has been provided.
