Objective/Learning Target:

Students will use stage composition to recreate a famous photograph or painting.



Stage Composition



Let's Get Started / Warm Up Activities:

Watch the video of a dance routine from So You Think You Can Dance. How does the body movement, positions, and physical movement tell a story? What is the story in your opinion?



Lesson/Activity:

Today, you will use what you learned about stage composition to recreate a famous work of art. As you look at the work of art, think of the elements of stage composition and how they are used in the paintings/photographs to tell a story. As a reminder, here are the elements:

<u>Body Positions</u> <u>Vertical Level</u>

<u>Planes</u> <u>Horizontal Location</u>

<u>Focus</u> <u>Contras</u>





Practice/Activity:



- First, research famous paintings and photographs and choose one that inspires you to recreate.
- 2. Next, research and learn about the piece of art:
 - a. Name of the painting/photograph. How does this help you interpret the story?
 - b. Artist
 - c. Time Period, what was going on historically during this time period
- 3. Now, study the composition of the work of art and decide how you can use what you have at home to recreate it. After, you have recreated it, snap a photo.
- 4. Analyze and compare the photo to the original. Is there anything you would rework or change?
