#### **Practice:**

- 2. Who cannot find their coin purse in order to pay the cab driver?
- 3. What does the cab driver tell Veta about the injection?

After you have answered these questions, let's figure out the climax.

What was in the Inciting Incident for the play *Harvey?* 

So, when and how does that character reserve their intention?

THAT IS THE CLIMAX!!!! You should have stated something to the effect that after hearing the cab driver talk about the effects of injection, Veta demands that Elwood not receive the injection.

- 2. Who does Elwood find at the end of the play?
