Learning Objective:

The student will create character backgrounds from reading a play.

Bell Ringer:

What is a memory play? Who is considered the narrator in the play? The character of Amanda lives in the past. Defend this statement with a couple of examples from the play.

Lesson Steps:

If you are cast in a play, the first thing that you should do is to study the play. You need to understand the plot, themes, and characters' backgrounds, motivations, and relationships.

Today, you will continue studying *The Glass Menagerie* by Tennessee Williams. The character of Jim will not arrive, yet; but much will be said about him. Make sure that you write down things that are said about Jim on his character shopping list form.
