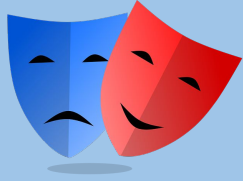

Go sit in your bedroom. Describe the space with specific details. What impression, feeling, or story do you think your bedroom tells?





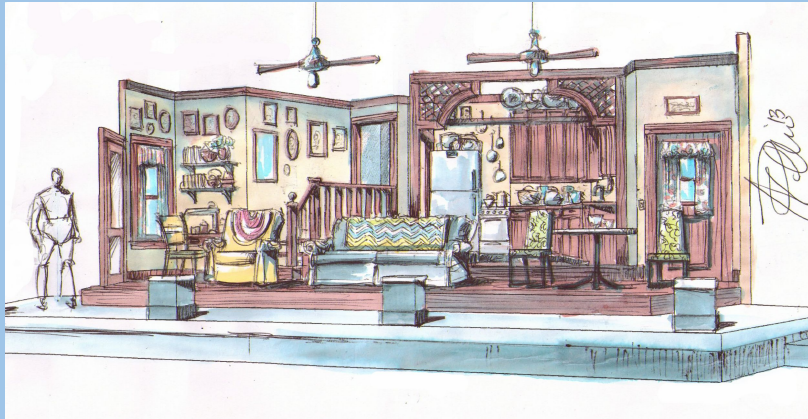
# Lesson Steps: Stage/Space/Sets

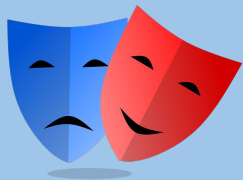
Now that you have studied the elements of design, you will put that knowledge to practice.

Today, you will draw a front view rendering of a design.

A rendering is the front view of what the audience would see. It should...

- Be in color
- Be detailed
- Include set dressing (if it is a room...rugs, pictures, etc.)





# Practice: Rendering, Dream Bedroom



At the beginning of this lesson, you were asked to describe your current bedroom in detail. Now, you are going to design a set for what you would call: **THE DREAM BEDROOM!**

1. First, describe your dream bedroom. How big would it be? Colors? Furniture? Decor? Windows? Closets?
2. What feeling would you want those that enter the room to experience? How can you emphasize this feeling through design elements? Line? Color? Texture? Etc.
3. Now, that you have brainstormed draw out a front view rendering of your set design for **THE DREAM BEDROOM!**
