# Lesson/Activity - Tips for Rough Draft writing

- Always begin with your first main point. Make sure you explain to your audience enough about your topic to be able to understand the rest of the speech.
- Never begin with your introduction. You might have ideas for your introduction, and you can brainstorm them. But, you can't introduce someone you don't know. Likewise, you can't introduce a speech you don't know.
- Follow your outline! But, also be open to changing the outline. There will be a lot of back and forth in this process. That's OK!
- As you write, don't worry about using the "perfect" word each time. Just get your ideas down on paper. This is a rough draft, that will go through many revisions as the competitive season goes on.
- Write MORE than what you need. If you speak at a rate of 130 words per minute, that would be approximately 1300 words. Good public speakers usually speak even slower than that.

#### Practice

Write your rough draft!

Your goal is to get to a final copy; don't rush through the rough draft. You have until September-ish to get this mostly formed.
