Lesson/Activity

Today will be our last practice day for our Recommendation speech.

Let's first think about pitch. Pitch is the vocal notes that you hit while speaking - the highs and lows of your voice.

If you speak in a monotone, then you deliver all of your words methodically at almost the same rate and pitch.

Next, let's talk about <u>how to move.</u> All movement should be purposeful. Let's figure out how we are going to add planned movement to your speeches.

As you watch the video, mark places on your outline where you can add movement.

Don't forget about <u>gestures</u>. Be sure to find key places in your speech to add gestures.
