Objective/Learning Target: Students will evaluate group dynamics and presentations.

Bell Ringer/Let's Get Started

<u>Groupthink</u> occurs when group members accept information and ideas without subjecting them to critical analysis.

Think of a few times you have witnessed groupthink.

What steps can groups take to make sure they function effectively?

Lesson/Activity

- Everyone should begin by reading this simple <u>Case Example</u> to get some basics on World Schools Debate case writing.
- OUTLINE:
 - Attention-Getting Device
 - Statement of what side you are supporting (Gov or Opp)
 - Definitions of key terms
 - Main arguments grouped into Contentions (probably 2)
 - Conclusion

Lesson/Activity

- Determine how you would like you to split the case writing assignment. If there are
 three people on a team I would suggest (1) introduction/1st substantive argument, (2)
 2nd substantive argument/conclusion and (3) introduction/conclusion and third
 substantive argument. Keeping in mind that the 1st and second substantive argument
 will need to be put together into one speech. Consult the sample case as a guide for
 the work.
- Choose one of the following motions to prepare. Note: you will prepare BOTH sides.
- 1. This House believes that schools have the right to punish cyberbullying that occurs outside of school.
- 2. This House would fine individuals who do not recycle at home.
- 3. This House believes that schools should ban violent sports for students in grades K-12.
- 4. This House regrets the rise of the social media "influencer."
