► Pronoun-Verb Contractions

Use an apostrophe to put a pronoun and the verb "to be" together to form a contraction.



Contraction	Example
1 + am = I'm	I'm Mrs. Patch.
you + are = you're	You're at the Natural History Museum.
he + is = he's she + is = she's it + is = it's	Look at this bird. It's a falcon.
we + are = we're	We're happy to have birds like this.
they + are = they're	They're wonderful animals.
