What's a Plural Noun?

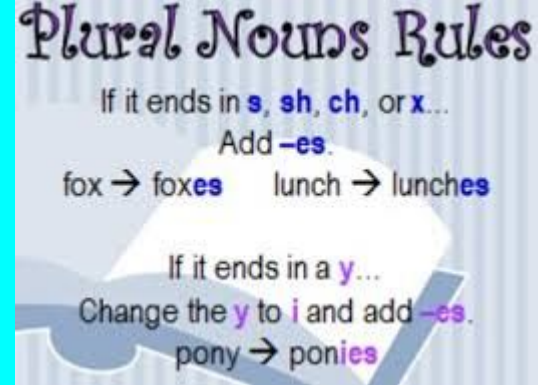
It's a word that names more than one thing.

One	More Than One
A singular noun names one thing	A plural noun names more than one thing



The Rules

Use these spelling rules for forming plural nouns



1. To make most nouns plural, just add **-s**.
2. If the noun ends in **s, z, sh, ch, or x**, add **-es**.
3. If the noun ends in **y** after the consonant, change the y to i and add **-es**.
4. Some nouns have special plural forms. (Woman-----> Women)
