

## What is an Indefinite Pronoun?



How do you use an indefinite pronoun?

### Example: **Everyone** loves an auto race. Your turn: **Everyone** Example: **Something** in that car is broken Your turn: **Something**

Everyone and Something are indefinite pronouns.

# Some indefinite pronouns are always singular, so they need a **singular verb** that ends in -s.

Example: Now everything looks fine for the big race.
