Revise Your Draft

Your first Draft is done. Now, you need to polish it, improve the development of ideas and your choice of supporting ideas.

Good writing contains **well-developed ideas.** A good writer **elaborates,** or builds, on his or her ideas by providing specific details for support.

The idea of this lesson is to help you polish your first draft. Make it better and more detailed.



Use a Graphic Organizer

Use details and facts to build on your ideas or statements. Use the graphic organizer to ensure you complete development of ideas.

Complete Development of Ideas	Incomplete Development of Ideas
All Ideas are explained	Some ideas are not fully explained.
Examples and details help readers understand ideas	Readers may feel confused about ideas.
The writing answers important questions that clarify the main ideas.	Readers have important questions that were not answered in the writing.
