Practice:

Part 2 of this project is going to consist of the preliminary and final floor plan sketches of your new space.

1. Take your two or three favorite bubble diagram options and create quick line sketches
2. Review these different options with your client and receive feedback
3. Use client feedback and create final sketch of design chosen by client.

Buildings are rarely if ever designed from the inside out. Be sure that when you are creating your new space that you are designing the exterior of the space at the same time. The interior affects the exterior and vice versa.
