-ER Verbs

Remember that the main forms of many French verbs end in the letters “er.” To use these verbs in a sentence, replace the “er” with different letters depending on the word or words used to start the sentence.

If the word is, replace “er” with If the word is..., replace the “er” with

Je	-e	Nous	-ons
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Tu	-es	Vous	-ez
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Il/Elle	-e	Ils/Elles	-ent
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Example

Parler = To speak

Je parle = I speak

Tu parles = You speak

Il parle = He speaks

Elle parle = She speaks

Nous parlons = We speak

Vous parlez = You (all) speak

Ils parlent = They speak

Elles parlent = They (all female) speak

What ending do you use if your sentence does not start with one of the words listed above?

If your sentence starts with a word or words designating one person or thing, use the il/elle ending “e.”

Example: Marc parle italien.

If your sentence starts with a word or words designating more than one person or thing, use the ils/elles ending “ent.”

Example: Marc et Julien jouent au tennis.
