Objective/Learning Target:

I count to 10 in German.



Bellwork:

Think to yourself. When you hear a number being said, do you think of a “word” or do you think of the “form” of the number.

For example:

When someone says a number, which do you think of first?

- a) “1”
- b) “one”

Let's review the numbers in German. If you can't remember how a number is spoken or you are learning this for the first time, let's watch a short video and then tie it together.

Let's see now each one individually and focus on pronunciation.

1- eins -- “eye” plus “nz”

2- zwei -- Remember, z makes a “ts” sound. “W” makes a “V” sound. To pronounce it correctly, you say something like **ts-v-eye**.



Let's see now each one individually and focus on pronunciation.

3- drei -- “dry”.

4- vier -- “fear”

5- fünf -- “foonf” is pretty close. Practice making the “ü” sound by saying “ee” from the word “cheese” and pushing your cheeks forward with your hands. Your lips should be sticking out.



Let's see now each one individually and focus on pronunciation.

6- sechs -- “zecks”

7- sieben -- “zeeben”

8- acht -- “ahckt” -- try to phlegm this one up a bit.



Let's see now each one individually and focus on pronunciation.

9- neun -- say the word “annoy” -- the “noy” is the sound you want. “noyn”

10- zehn -- “tsayn” -- Like “just sayin”.

0- nul -- “nool”

Jetzt machen wir Mathe.

Find the answer to these simple math problems! Answers on the next slide.
Pronunciation practice in the brackets. German also uses the word “plus” and “minus”

Plus \rightarrow + [“ploos”] Minus \rightarrow - [“meenus”]

a) eins plus neun =

e) zehn minus neun =

b) zwei plus fünf =

f) drei minus eins =

c) sechs plus zwei =

g) acht minus zwei =

d) acht minus sieben =

h) sieben minus sieben =

Answers:

a) eins plus neun = zehn (10)

b) zwei plus fünf = sieben (7)

c) sechs plus zwei = neun (9)

d) acht minus sieben = zwei (2)

e) zehn minus neun = eins (1)

f) drei minus eins = zwei (2)

g) acht minus zwei = sechs (6)

h) sieben minus sieben = nul (0)



Practice:

Try to count as quickly as you can from 0-10. Time yourself and see what your fastest time is.

Challenge: Teach someone else in your house how to count to 10 in German and see who can do it the quickest!
