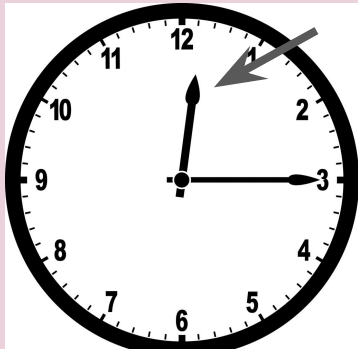
Before the process is broken down, let's watch a short video.



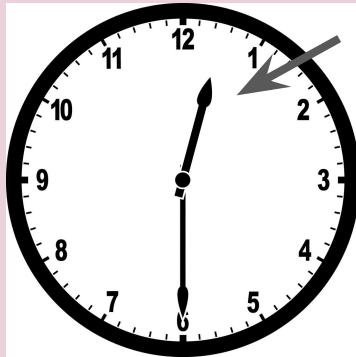
Let's look at a common mistakes that the video doesn't cover.

As the minute hand (long hand) moves quickly, the hour hand (short hand) moves along with it but much more slowly. Notice: at **12:55**, the hour hand almost seems to point at 1:00, but the minute hand hasn't gone past "12".

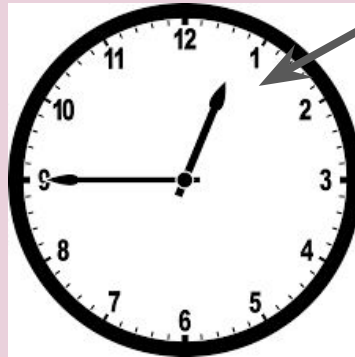

## Cultural Differences:

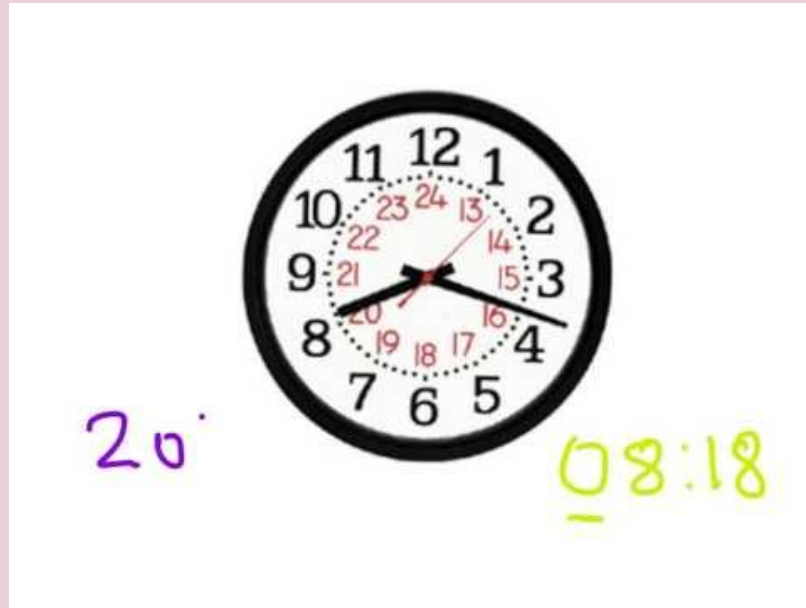
In the United States, we use a 12-hour format to tell time.

We use a.m. to tell time in the morning. Ex. 10:00am (Morning)

We use p.m. to tell time in the afternoon. Ex. 10:00pm (Night)

Most of the world, however, uses the 24-hour format or what we call “military time”.

Here's a short video about 24-hour time. Follow along and then we'll practice on the next slide.
