Each number has two parts.

The number and then an ending.

In German, it is very similar. Let's take a look.

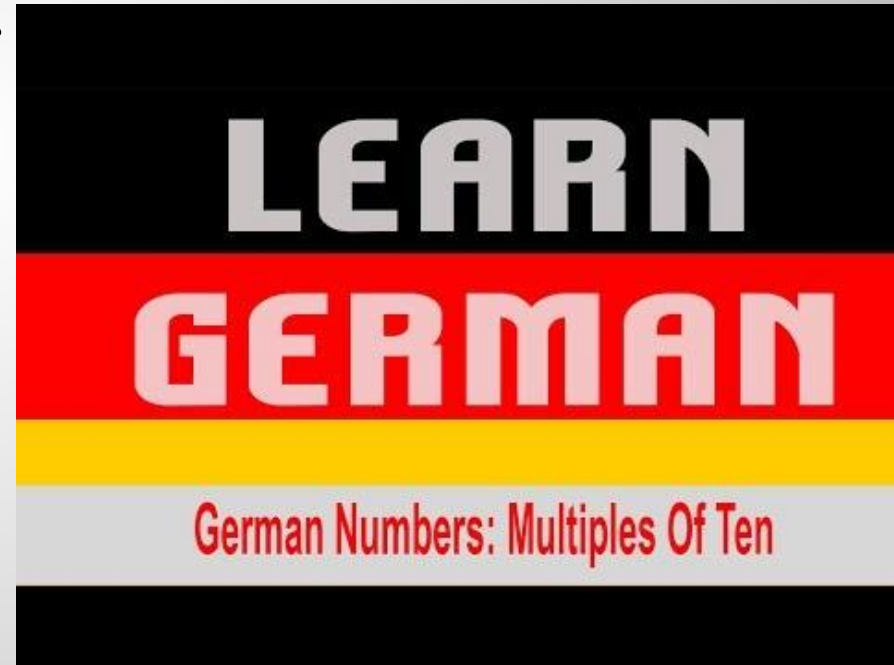
The **number** and then an **ending**.
