

Una Lección de Rufino Tamayo 1899 - 1991

TAMAYO- NIÑEZ (CHILDHOOD)

- Tamayo was born in Oaxaca, Mexico
- At the age of 12 his mother died and he moved to live with his aunt.
- He is of Zapotec heritage which was an influence on his artwork.
- He enrolled at the Escuela Nacional de Artes Plasticas in San Carlos in 1917.

TAMAYO - EARLY CAREER

- Tamayo didn't agree with the politics of the Mexican Revolution (unlike Rivera, Orozco and Siqueiros) and didn't choose this theme as a focus. Instead he focused on traditional Mexico.
- During the Mexican Revolution he moved to New York City.
- Rufino's chosen medium was
 <u>Mixografia</u> which he created along with Luis Remba.

- CAREER AND LATER LIFE

- 1935 Tamayo and his wife Olga move to NYC for a little over a decade.
- In 1948 he has his first major retrospective in Mexico City.
- In 1949 Tamayo and Olga move to Paris for a decade.
- One of Tamayo's favorite subjects was his wife Olga.

FUN FACT - A TAMAYO PAINTING WAS STOLEN AND TRASHED

A Houston man bought the painting for his wife's birthday and when they moved it was stolen. The couple reported it stolen and offered a \$15,000 reward. Twenty years later, Elizabeth Gibson found a painting in the dumpster outside her NY apartment building. She decided to grab it even though she didn't know much about art. She began to investigate the painting and saw it featured on Antiques Roadshow. Gibson and the former owner sold it as Sotheby's auction. Gibson received her \$15,000 reward and a portion of the \$1, 049,000 auction sale.
