Objective/Learning Target:

Warm Up Questions:

Warm Up Questions: Discussion

- 1. Why would a person go see a chiropractor? Chiropractic patients seek to have pain alleviated by adjustment of joints.
- Does a chiropractor have as much training as an MD? Most DC programs are
 7-years in length, which is comparable to many other medical professions.
