Overview of Public Safety

- What is Public Safety?
 - Careers that protect public from dangers that might affect their safety (crime, disasters) (Source: USLegal.com)
 - Careers designed to uphold the law and protect people (Source: Recruiter)
 - *Bottom line*: Agency/Agencies whose primary goal is to protect the public and keep them safe.

Overview of Public Safety

- Made up of many organizations, including police, fire, and Emergency Medical Services (EMS)
 - Countries can have a public safety department as part of the government, as can states and local governments.
 - Colleges and other large organizations can also have public safety divisions.
