Learning Target:

Students will be able to identify and explain the duties of an immigration official.



Key Terms

(Term definitions from Lexico.com)

- <u>Immigration</u>: The action of coming to live permanently in a foreign country.
- <u>Migration</u>: Movement of people to a new area or country in order to find work or better living conditions.
- Illegal Immigrant/Alien: A foreign national who is living without official authorization in a country of which they are not a citizen.
- ICE: Immigration and Customs Enforcement
 - "U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) employees protect America from the cross-border crime and illegal immigration that threaten national security and public safety. To carry out our mission, ICE focuses on legal and safe immigration enforcement, terrorism prevention and combating transnational criminal threats." ice.gov/careers
- **USCIS**: U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services
 - "USCIS is the government agency that oversees lawful immigration to the United States." uscis.gov/about-us



Opening Exercise

- Read <u>this</u> article about the recent death of a detainee in ICE custody due to COVID-19.
- Now, read <u>this</u> article from a couple weeks ago laying out how ICE modified their enforcement due to COVID. Then, reflect on these questions:
 - 1. Some functions of government have been limited or halted due to the pandemic. Do you believe ICE detainments and deportations should have been one of those elements that were limited or halted? Why/why not?
 - 2. Like inmates from various prisons and jails around the country, some ICE detainees were released in an effort to prevent their risk of infection. Do you feel like that is a wise decision? Why/why not?
