## Lesson/Activity

Today we are going to take explore the role of County Treasurer.

The Missouri County Treasurers Association explains the job of the Treasurer:

The role of the elected Treasurer is to serve the citizens of their County by performing all duties set forth by Missouri Statutes, mainly, but not limited to, Chapter 54 RSMo. The Treasurer is the custodian of all county money.

The primary task is careful accounting of revenues and expenditures and allocation of each to the proper fund.

The Treasurer fulfills administrative and executive duties for the County and exercises oversight and caretaker roles in regard to County funds.

#### **Practice**
