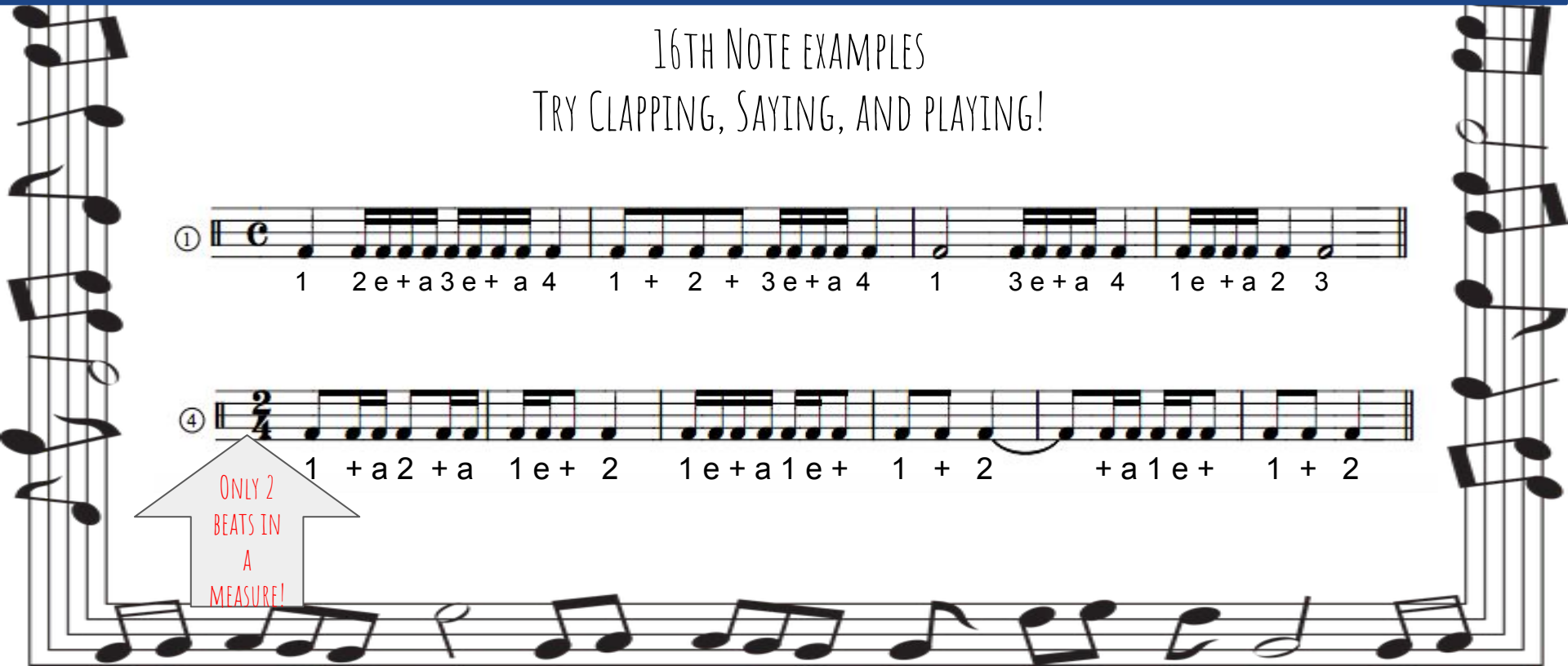

(REMEMBER: 3 TRIPLET NOTES FIT INTO ONE BEAT)

Example



1 2 3 la li 4 1 la li 2 la li 3 4 1 + 2 3 la li 4 1 la li 2 3 4

Instead of “la li”, try saying “1 and a” or “trip-o-let”

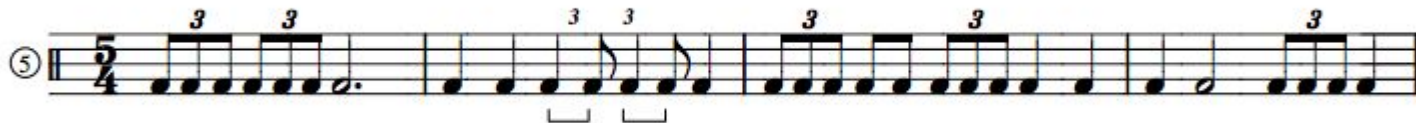


A FEW NOTES ABOUT TRIPLETS



↑
IF 3 TRIPLETS, FIT INTO A BEAT, THEN 6 TRIPLETS FIT INTO A HALF NOTE!

↑
OR 9 TRIPLETS FIT INTO A DOTTED HALF NOTE!



↑
TWO TRIPLETS FIT INTO WHAT LOOKS LIKE A QUARTER NOTE, WHEN THE "3" SHOWS THAT IT SHOULD BE A TRIPLET PATTERN.










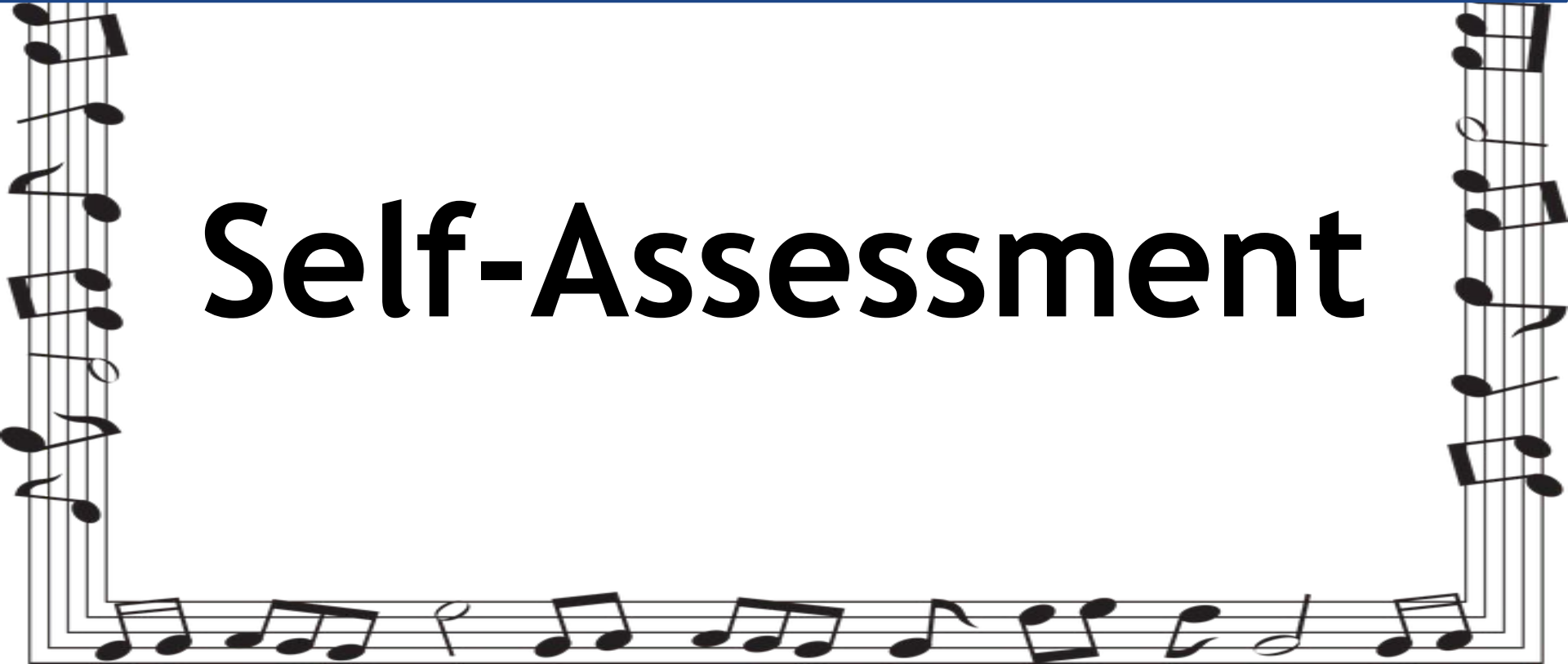
SIXTEENTH NOTE SIGHT RHYTHMS – THE SHED
