Lesson: Week One

Learning Target:

- Students will use Google Earth to research and plan a trip to Rome, Italy.
- Students will compare and contrast hotels, location, cost and amenities.
- Students will plan a route to visit different tourist attractions.
- This is a review of skills from first semester.

Standards:

Background:

This is a review from our Google Earth Unit from first semester.

- Students will use Google Earth to explore Rome using Google Earth.
- Students will research points of interest and explain why teachers should visit there.
- Students will use Hotels.com to compare and contrast hotels near the Colosseum.
- Students will compare and contrast possible flights to Rome.
- Students will create a budget for their trip to Rome.

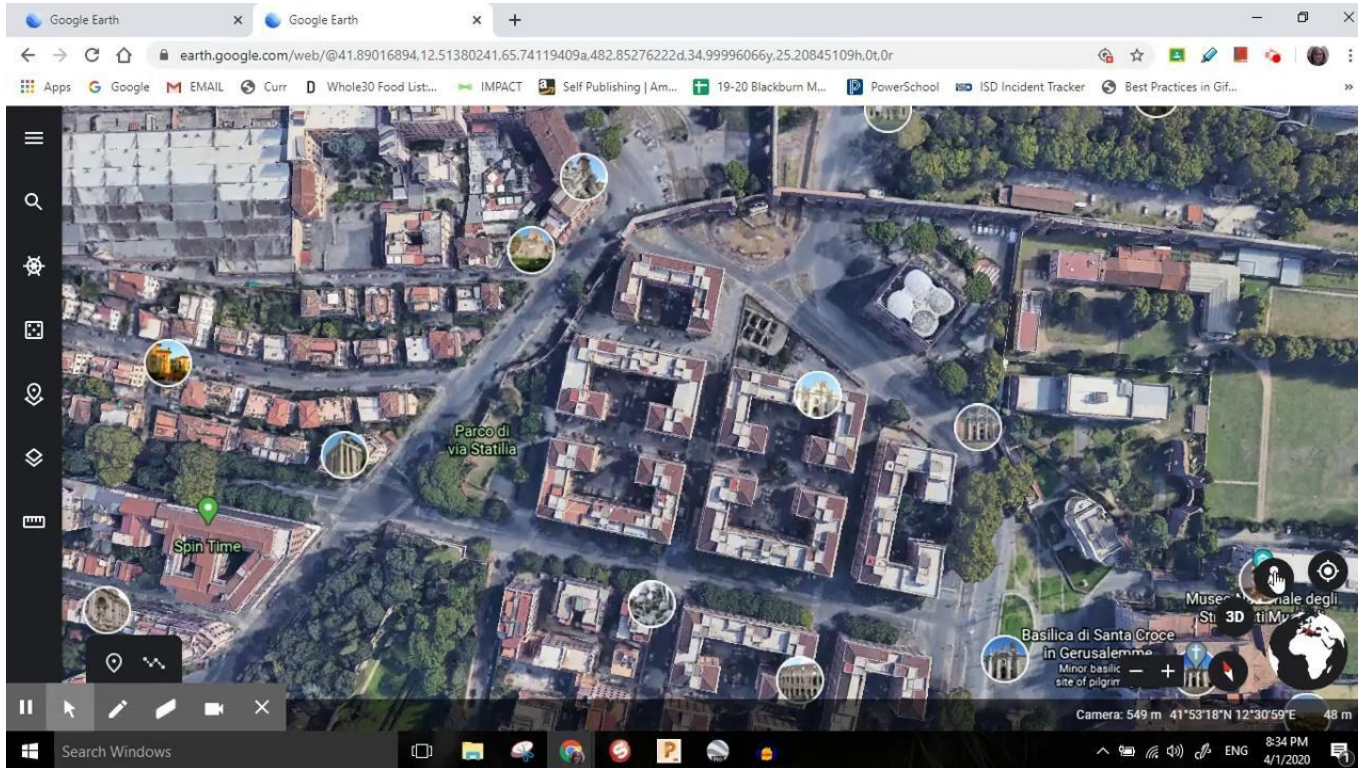
Taking a Trip to Rome!

Day One:

- Did you watch both videos on slide #4? Those videos will give you a lot of background information about places to visit in Rome. You can also look at the resources listed on the More Resources slide (#5)
- Now I want you to explore Rome using the online version of Google Earth. You can search out some of the places you saw on the video or from the websites. Today is just a day to get familiar with using Google Earth and looking around Rome!

Create a Google Doc for your trip to Rome.



Watch the video full screen so you can see everything. There will be a box in the lower right hand corner. Click on that and you will see the video full screen.



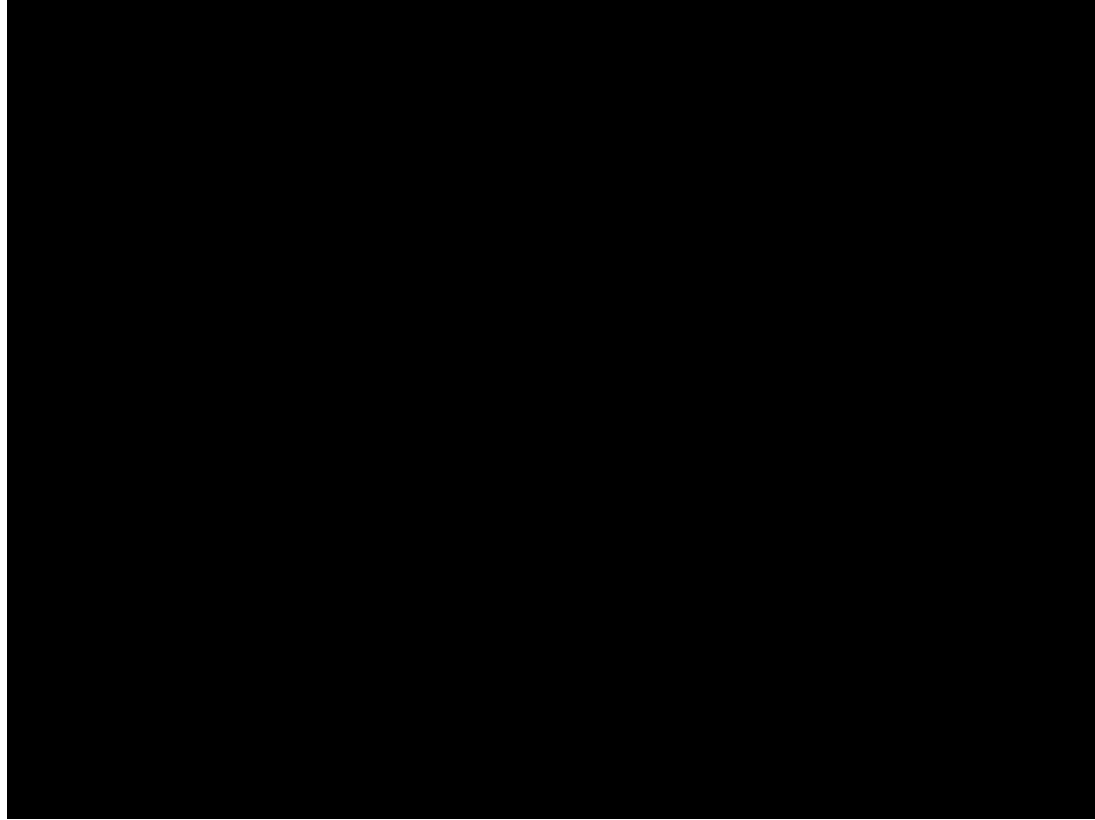

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Day Two:

- Now that you have explored Rome, you need to convince teachers which points of interest they should visit! Create a Google Doc with your information!
- Be sure to write in complete sentences with capital letters and punctuation.
- You need to have at least **FIVE** places to see, but you can always do more if you want!
- Directions on how to make your Google Doc is on the next slide.
- If you want to share it with Mrs. Bonner, she would love to see your work!
- Please do **NOT** copy and paste from the websites!! That is called plagiarism and it is **illegal!**

Create a Google Doc for your trip to Rome.



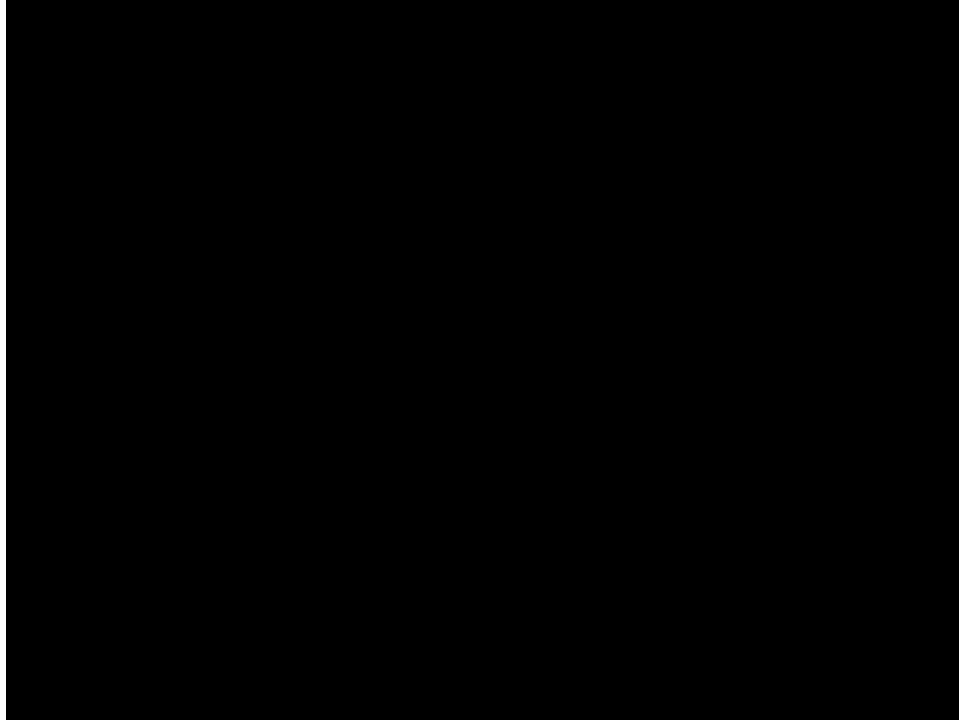
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Day Three:

- It's time to find a hotel! Go to Hotels.com and type in your destination as Rome, Italy.
- We will be going for a week in May. You get to pick the dates. Use the same dates for all of the hotels you research.
- On the left side of the screen it will list neighborhoods. You need to scroll below that and look at the landmarks. We want to stay near the Colosseum, so check the box next to it. Your hotel **cannot be more than two miles** away from the Colosseum.
- Your budget is \$200 a night. You **cannot** go over that price.
- You must list two hotels so that teachers can pick their favorite one.
- Be sure to list price, amenities and address.
- See the next slide for how to add this to your Google doc.

Adding Hotel Notes



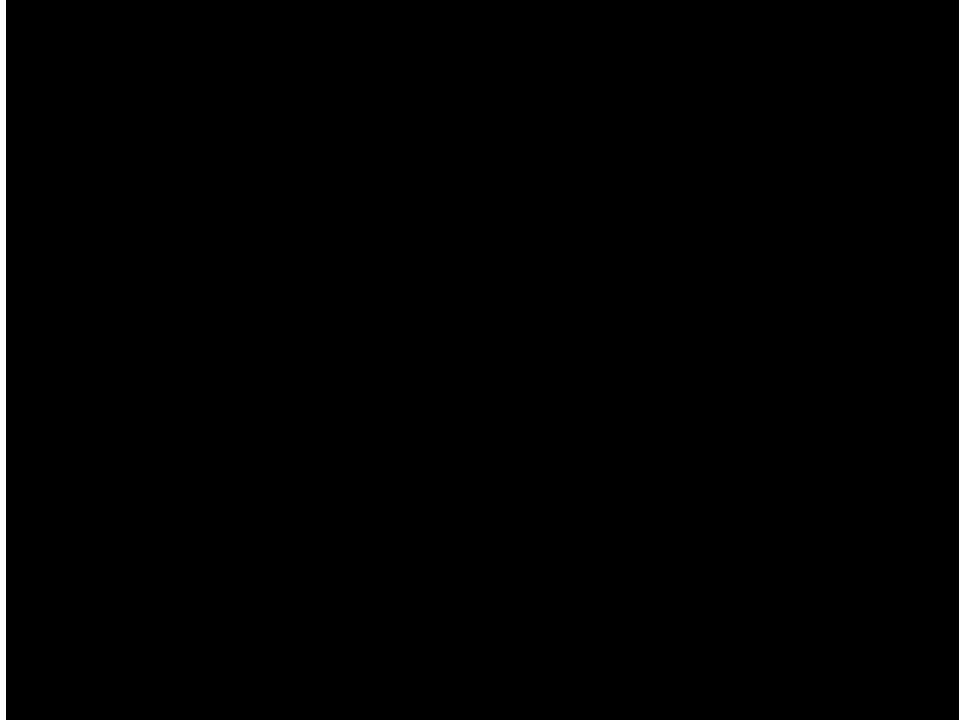
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Day Four:

- Today we are going to “book” our flights to travel to Rome.
- Watch the video on the next page to know where to go and what to look for on the website.
- Add your flight information to your Google doc.
- You will need to take a cab to your hotel since the airport is too far away from your hotel to walk. Remember to include Taxi fare at the end of this project when you create a budget!

Adding Flights

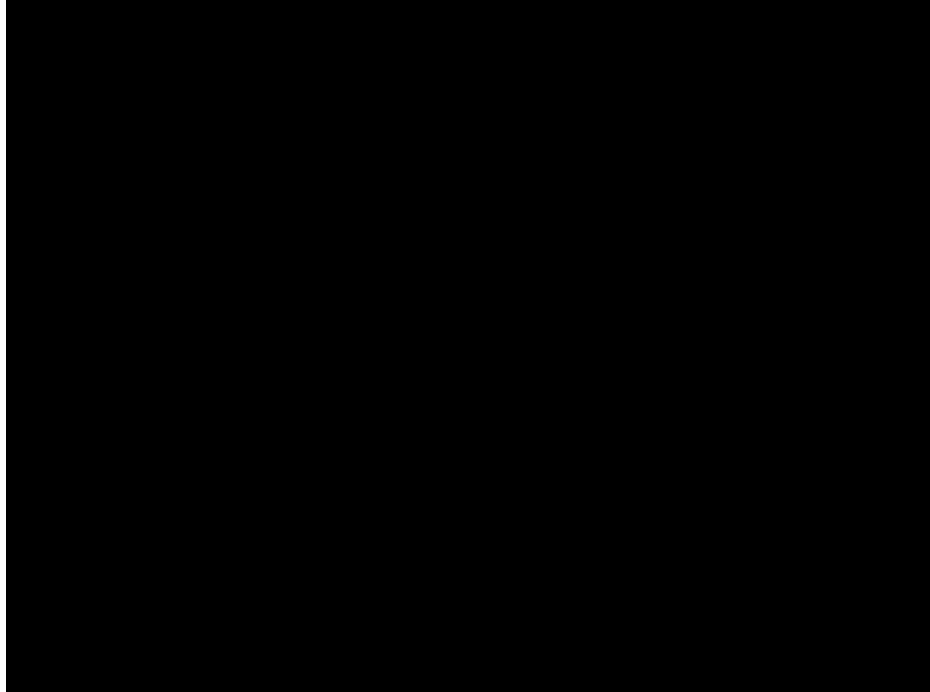


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Day Five:
