#### **Learning Targets:**

- Students will learn about vital community jobs that support families and neighbors.
- Students will read and learn about real people who work in their communities.
- Students will have the opportunity to create "kindness appreciation" projects throughout the week.
- Students will learn what a public service announcement (PSA) is and create a draft storyboard.
- Students will create their own PSA expressing their appreciation for workers in their community.



### The Science of Kindness

A recent study reported on how people felt after performing or observing kind acts every day for seven days. Participants were randomly assigned to carry out at least one more kind act than usual for someone close to them, an acquaintance or stranger, or themselves, or to try to actively observe kind acts. Happiness was measured before and after the seven days of kindness. The researchers found that being kind to ourselves or to anyone else — yes, even a stranger — or actively observing kindness around us boosted happiness. (Harvard Health Blog 4.18.19)


### **Envision Photo Contest 2019**

## Let's Meet Healthcare Workers in our Community





#### Meet Amber De Gama Rose

I'm a physical therapist at a small hospital. We are only allowed to see a few patients that have had surgery. So most of us are now working at screening tents/doors. I have to check people coming into our hospital campus for fevers and ask if they have any symptoms to approve them or not to come in.

#### What does a physical therapist do?

Physical therapists teach patients how to prevent or manage their condition so that they will achieve long-term health benefits. PTs examine each individual and develop a plan, using treatment techniques to promote the ability to move, reduce pain, restore function, and prevent disability. Occupational therapists work on fine motor skills and often work in schools.

#### What does a neuroscience nurse do?

A neuroscience nurse is a nursing professional that helps patients suffering from neurological problems. This can include injuries, such as head and spinal trauma from accidents, or illnesses, such as meningitis, inflammation of the brain, epilepsy, and multiple sclerosis.

## Let's Meet Mail Carriers in our Community





#### **Meet Anthoney Mitchell**

I am a mailman. During this time I have to keep a safe distance with my customers which is no fun. I cannot hand them their mail right now. I have to leave it in the mailbox. Every so often I'll come up to a mailbox and I'll have a gift from a concerned customer. It gives me a smile knowing they care.

#### What does a mail carrier do?

USPS mail carriers deliver mail to homes and businesses in cities, towns, and rural areas. They travel planned routes, collecting and delivering mail, obtaining signatures, and answering customer questions about postal regulations and services. Mail may be delivered on foot or by mail truck, depending on the location.

#### **Amazon Delivery**

Almost half of United States internet users start their product searches on Amazon, so it's no surprise when you see an Amazon delivery van in your neighborhood. Most Americans are limiting their shopping and the only stores that are open are grocery stores. So where are people buying their goods? Online! That means more business for Amazon! Amazon hired an additional 100,000 workers across the United States in March 2020 and has even implementing pay raises.



#### What does an Amazon employee do?

The task that most people perform is package scanning and placing them onto pallets. Packages come down via a large conveyor belt, and there are roughly 50 pallets on each side of the belt. You take a package from the belt, look at the sticker on it (which tells you which pallet it needs to go on), and then scan the package with your handheld scanner. You must stack the box on top of the other boxes that are already on the pallet, which can be hard. Each pallet will be stacked up to roughly 6ft tall before it is replaced by a new pallet. Skilled workers can process 180+ packages per hour.


## **Kindness Challenge!**

## Let's Meet School Employees in our Community






#### **Meet Amy Mansell**

#### What do farmers do?

Farmers might raise crops, livestock, poultry, fish and shellfish, or produce dairy products, ornamental plants or nursery products. Some farmers raise both crops and livestock or produce food for their animals on the farm. Each type of farming requires specialized skills and knowledge.

#### **Meet Gayle Wilson**

Our agency administers federal farm programs through the Farm Service Agency. This will include conservation programs that protect wildlife habitats, disaster programs that offer cost share assistance due to natural disasters such as tornadoes and floods. We administer the DMC program that is a safety net program for dairy producers when prices fall. And we will be the agency that will administer the federal relief money that has been promised for agriculture producers from the Covid 19 situation.



#### What Does the USDA Farm Service Agency do?

Since the 1930s, FSA has provided invaluable support to America's ag producers. Today, Farm Service Agency's responsibilities are organized into five mission areas: Farm Programs, Farm Loans, Commodity Operations, Management, and State Operations.

#### What is a Public Service Announcement?

A PSA (Public Service Announcement) is a short informational clip that is meant to raise the audience's awareness about an important issue. PSAs may include interviews, dramatizations, animations and many other types of video and audio content.

#### **Your Mission:**

Educate others about the necessary work that people are doing during the Missouri Stay At Home order. Make sure you show appreciation in your PSA for the work they are doing in their communities!

#### What makes a PSA effective?

- It gets the audience to pay attention.
- The message is clear and easy to understand
- The message is supported by facts about the issue.
- The audience is able to sympathize with those affected by the issue.





#### **Hook the Audience!**

Find a way to make your PSA interesting! It could start with a shocking fact, have comedy, play on viewers emotions or be an important topic for your audience.

#### **Get Your Facts Straight!**

If you want to create a PSA about a job that was not featured in this lesson, be sure to research that job. Add information that will grab your audience's attention. If your message has incorrect facts, you will quickly lose credibility.

#### Be Straightforward!

Make your point clearly. Stay on topic and do not add extra information that is not needed. You want your viewers to understand the message you are trying to relate to them.
