LS/CBSS/FS Basic Reading Lesson Lesson: April 21, 2020

Learning Target:

Students will increase basic reading skills to read a text that is instructionally appropriate (at his/her reading level)

Background: This is a review lesson in Basic Reading Skills-Fluency and Sight Word IT


- Students will increase phonemic awareness by reading high frequency words (reviewing the word IT).
- Students will increase phonemic awareness by demonstrating decoding skills when reading.
- Students will increase the ability to read appropriate texts with fluency (rate, accuracy, expression, appropriate phrasing).

Let's Get Started:

- 1. Let's review the word IT with our Word of the Day song
- 2. Practice words on the WORD WALL (This activity could also be completed in a Notebook)

Word of the Day Song

Make a word wall

Materials- 3 x 5 cards or Post It Notes Marker, Crayon or Pencil



After posting your words on your word wall have your student point to the word 'IT' and then also reviewing the word 'THE' as well as the word 'AND'. (you can also do this in a Notebook or by viewing this slide).




Practice #1

Directions- Parent, read the passage below to your student, or have them read the passage independently. Make a verbal emphasis on the word 'it' each time you come to it. Have your student follow along in the reading by following your words with their finger. If they are reading independently, you may prompt them with sounding out unknown words. After reading the passage, have your student go back and point out the word 'it' and see if they can identify all the times that the word is used.

I see an owl. Can you see it? I see it. It is up in the tree. It is little and brown. It is looking at me.

Practice #2 Print and complete this <u>page</u>.


Parents- for independent readers, try timing each read thru. Students should be able to read more quickly and smoothly with each practice.

3. Use your mouse to click and smash the word brick with the word that has been spoken aloud




