LS/CBSS/FS Basic Reading Lesson Lesson: April 23, 2020

Learning Target:

Students will increase basic reading skills to read a text that is instructionally appropriate (at his/her reading level)

Background: This is a review lesson in Basic Reading Skills-Fluency and Sight Word YOU

- Students will increase phonemic awareness by reading high frequency words (reviewing the word YOU).
- Students will increase phonemic awareness by demonstrating decoding skills when reading.
- Students will increase the ability to read appropriate texts with fluency (rate, accuracy, expression, appropriate phrasing).

Let's Get Started:

- 1. Let's review the word YOU with our Word of the Day song
- 2. Practice words on the WORD WALL (This activity could also be completed in a Notebook)

Word of the Day Song

(Sing to the tune of B-I-N-G-0)

Our focus word of the day: You

There was a sight word of the day and <u>you</u> was our sight word y-o-u , y-o-u spell it and you was our Sight Word!


Review word wall vocabulary

Directions- View the following words that we previously wrote on the Note Cards or Post-Its and posted in a prominent place in the home. Review the words, and say the words aloud as you point to each word.



Reviewing the word wall

After reviewing words on your word wall, have your student point to the word 'YOU' and then also review the word 'IT' as well as the words 'THE' and 'AND'. (you can also do this in a Notebook or by viewing these slides). Have them say them say the words out loud as they point to the word you have said.




Practice #1

Directions- Parent, read the passage below to your student, or have them read the passage independently. Make a verbal emphasis on the word 'you' each time you come to it. Have your student follow along in the reading by following your words with their finger. If they are reading independently, you may prompt them with sounding out unknown words. After reading the passage, have your student go back and point out the word 'you' and see if they can identify all the times that the word is used.

Do you want pizza? I will get you a slice of pizza. Do you want a burger? I will get you one burger. Do you want some milk? I will get you a glass of milk.


Parents- for independent readers, try timing each read thru. Students should be able to read more quickly and smoothly with each practice.



4. When all are correct, play again or try the next level






