Learning Target:

Students will use background knowledge and clues from the text to make inferences.

Background: This is a review lesson.

- Students will use clues from the text.
- Students will use their own background knowledge.
- Students will make inferences.


Why?

Many times, information is not specifically stated in the text. Knowing how to make inferences is an important skill in comprehending reading material. Let's Get Started: Watch Videos:

How Do I Make Inferences?

- 1. Identify the clues in the text.
- 2. Use your own background knowledge.
- 3. Put the clues and the background knowledge together to make an inference.



Example #1:

Just after the morning bell rang, Steven rushed into the classroom, threw his backpack onto a hook, and hurried to his seat. As Steven took his seat, Ms. Smith shook her head and didn't seem to be surprised.

? Clues	Background Knowledge	Inference	
The morning bell rang.	The morning bell means that school is starting.	School is ready to begin and students should be seated.	
Steven was rushing.	People rush when they are in a hurry or trying not to be late.	Steven is late for school.	
Ms. Smith shook her head.	People shake their heads when disappointed.	Ms. Smith is disappointed that Steven is late.


Awaiting Dad
