# Following One-step Directions April 2020



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Learning Target
Students will follow one-step directions using positional words.

# **Background Information**

#### Following directions

is an important skill that we use in our daily lives whether it is a student following directions at school or an adult following directions at his or her job.

To do this skill well takes practice.

This lesson will help your young one begin to perform the skills it takes to follow directions.

#### Just how do I Follow Directions?

First, **listen** carefully to the direction.



Think about what is being said and put a "movie" on in your head about what you are to do. Visualize yourself doing the direction.



**Ask** questions about anything you don't understand.



**Repeat** the direction out loud or to yourself.



Then, **do** the direction!



In this lesson we are going to practice **following directions** using the words

In front of, behind, and between.










These words tell us where something is. Watch and sing along with this <u>song</u> to learn about these words.

Let's put the octopus in front of the whale.




#### The octopus is **in front of** the whale.





Let's put the turtle **between** the starfish.





#### The turtle is **between** the starfish.






#### Let's put the jellyfish **behind** the seahorse.





## The jellyfish is **behind** the seahorse.



The jellyfish is **behind** the seahorse.



# Now let's see if you can follow these directions when someone says them out loud to you.

Don't forget the steps to remember what to do.

- Put a teddy bear in front of the TV.
- 2. Stand **between** two toys.
- 3. Put a toy car **behind** the curtain.
- 4. Sit **between** two chairs.
- 5. Put a spoon **in front of** a cup.
- 6. Stand **behind** your pet (or a stuffed animal).
- Run and turn in circles in front of a tree!
- 8. Go outside and sit **between** two plants.
- 9. Go outside and stand **behind** a bush or flower.





# More Practice!





Point to the picture that shows the correct place of where the fish is.

- The fish is **behind** the boat.
- The fish is **in front of** the boat.



- The fish is **in front of** the diver.
- The fish is **between** the divers.
- The fish is **behind** the diver.
