LS/CBSS/FS Basic Reading Lesson Plans Lesson: April 30, 2020

Learning Target:

Students will increase basic reading skills to read a text that is instructionally appropriate (at his/her reading level)

Background: This is a review lesson in Basic Reading Skills-Fluency and Sight Word TO

- Students will increase phonemic awareness by reading high frequency words (reviewing the word TO).
- Students will increase phonemic awareness by demonstrating decoding skills when reading.
- Students will increase the ability to read appropriate texts with fluency (rate, accuracy, expression, appropriate phrasing).

Let's Get Started:

- 1. Let's review the word TO with our Word of the Day song
- 2. Review the word wall(This activity could also be completed in a Notebook)
- 3. Listen to the Sight Word Rap, and see if you can spell the words with the song- Sight Word Rap 1 | Sight Words | High Frequency Words | Jump Out Words | Jack Hartmann

Word of the Day Song


(Sing to the tune of B-I-N-G-0)

Review the word wall

Review the words on your word wall: Have your student point to the word 'TO' and then also reviewing the words 'IN', 'IT', 'YOU', 'THE' and 'AND'. (you can also do this in a Notebook or by viewing this slide).



Practice #1


Directions- Parent, read the passage below to your student, or have them read the passage independently. Make a verbal emphasis on the word 'to' each time you come to it. Have your student follow along in the reading by following your words with their finger. If they are reading independently, you may prompt them with sounding out unknown words. After reading the passage, have your student go back and point out the word 'to' and see if they can identify all the times that the word is used.

Where does Lucy want to go? Lucy wants to go to the beach. Where does Theo want to go? Theo wants to go camping. Where does Zahra want to go? Zahra wants to go fishing.


