Learning Target:
Students will answer
Who, Where, and What Questions

Background Information:

Answering wh- questions takes a lot of different language skills. In order to answer a wh question, a child must be able to:

- understand the question word.
- understand the grammar of the question.
- understand each vocabulary word in the question.
- make sense of the information and the social context.
- formulate a response and put the words together.
- give the response.

Why is it so Important?

Being able to answer wh- questions is important for:

- participating in conversations with others.
- answering questions at school.
- demonstrating knowledge on tests.
- being able to follow directions and stay safe.
- demonstrating an understanding of school material.

In this lesson, we are going to talk about answering questions beginning with who, where, and what.

Typically, children develop the skill of asking and answering who, where, and what questions between the ages of 2 and 4.

Sometimes children are delayed in developing these skills and need extra practice in understanding the meaning of these question words before they are able to begin to ask questions appropriately.

Who?






