Listen carefully to give the correct answer.



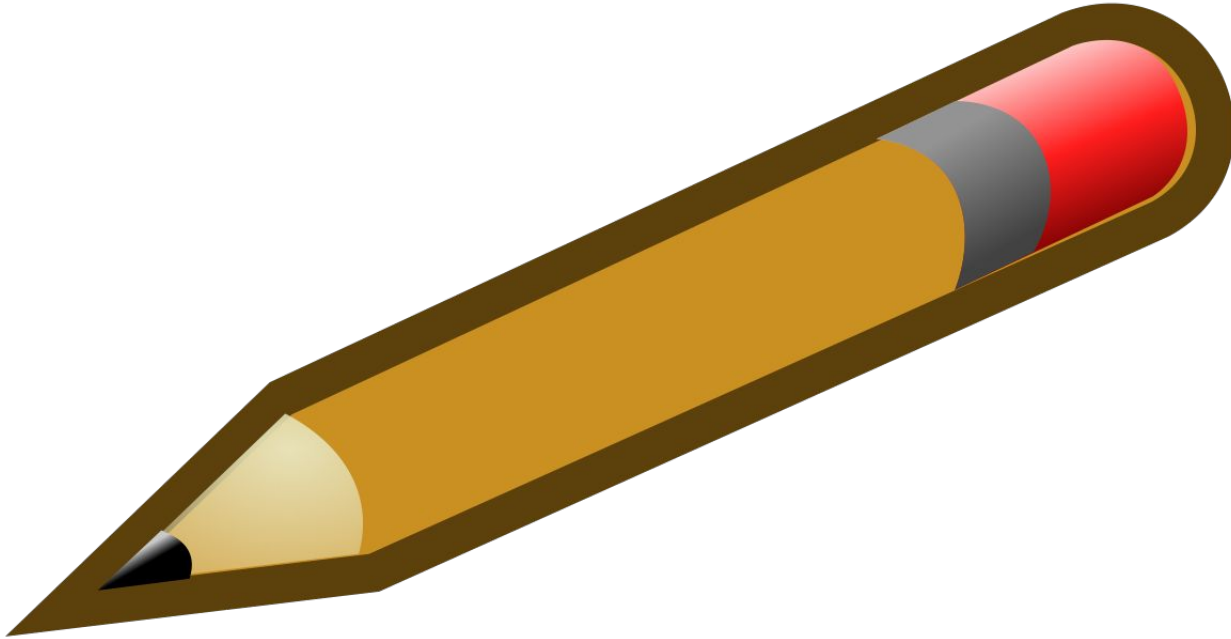
Can a chair go to sleep?
