I can write my name!

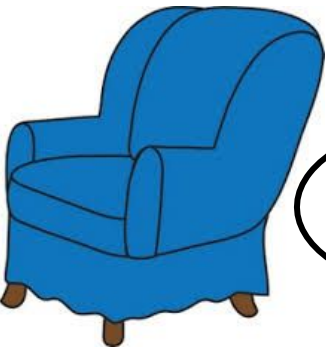
Blank handwriting lines for practice.

Practice #2: Write the Room

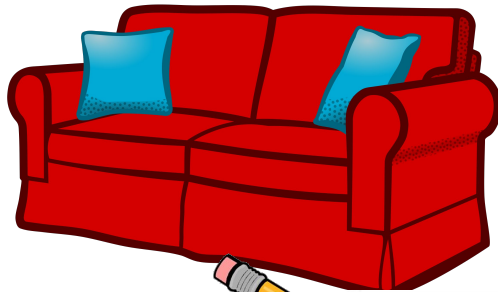
Draw and label 3 things you see in your living room.

A sentence needs:

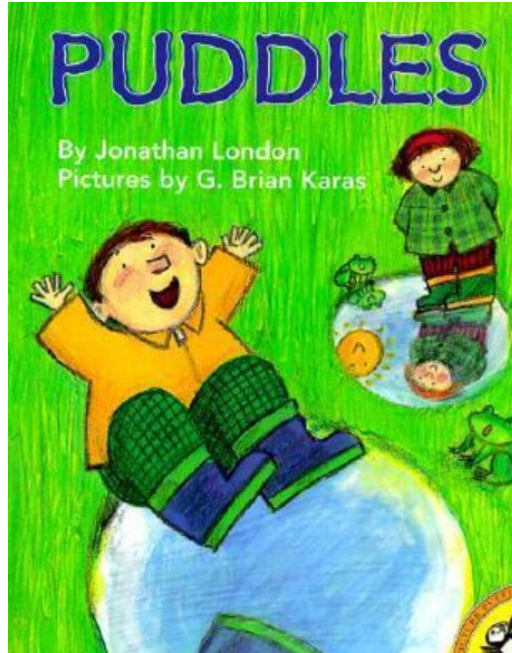
- A capital letter
