Functional Skills, Life Skills, CBSS Writing Lesson: April 23

Learning Target:

Students will use dictation, pictures and words to write on a topic.

*Create a free account at <u>pebblego.com</u> or use your building code to work through this lesson (ask your teacher for the code).

Background: Students use sounds, sight words, and pictures to write about a topic.

- Students will use pictures to draw about a topic
- Students will use words to write about a topic
- Students will use a combination of drawing and writing to name and inform about a topic being studied

Let's Get Started:

- 1. Review phonics sounds in the <u>Jolly review</u>
- 2. Review <u>sight words</u>
- 3. Watch Video: <u>Parts of a Sentence</u>

Practice #1:

Warm up by writing your first and last name using capitalization and <u>formation</u>. Click on the picture for a printable version of the name practice page.

Write your child's name on the line using a highlighter, then have them trace.
