Objective/Learning Target:

The student will learn basic ELA Curriculum Vocabulary and apply these skills by matching words with definitions and applying the concepts to sentences.



Background information: When we speak we use our word choices, how our voice sounds, and pauses in our speech to give meaning to what we say.

When we write we use punctuation to provide meaning. We are going to learn about some of ways we give written language meaning.

Word Targets: punctuation, capitalize, question mark, exclamation point, period.

Let's Get Started: Here are the definitions for these words.

Punctuation:

These are the marks we use when we write.



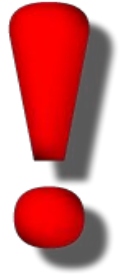
Question Mark:

This is the mark at the end of a question
(a question is what you ask to get an
answer).



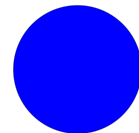
Exclamation Point:

This is the mark at the end of a sentence that shown strong feeling.



Period:

This is the mark at the end of a sentence that makes it a statement (telling).



Capitalize:

This is when you change a letter from lowercase to uppercase.
