Learning Target:

Students will use dictation, pictures and words to write on a topic.

Background: Students use sounds, sight words, and pictures to write about a topic.



All About Writing


This type of writing is teaching.

Practice on your own: Read along with the passage to learn about the bear habitat.


Click on the speaker to login to PebbleGo and read along with the words.
