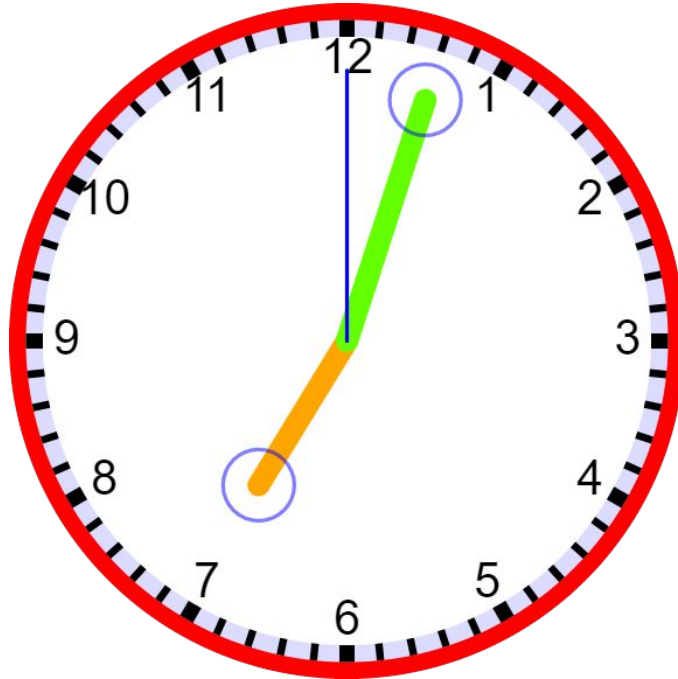
# Practice #1:

#### Clock Types

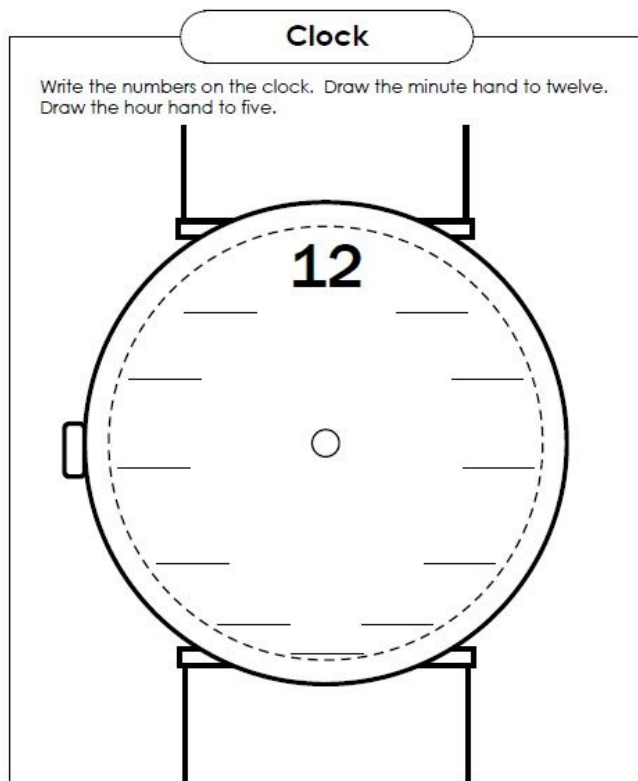


This **digital** clock has the time right on it. You might have one of these at home or on your watch. At school, we practice telling time on the **analog** clock

# Practice on your own:

## Clock Face Worksheet

1. Print out the worksheet or have an adult draw you this clock on paper
2. Write the numbers on the clock on the lines around the clock
3. Draw the big hand and little hand--HINT:look at a clock at home to see the hands
4. Have an adult tell you what time your clock says.



**Don't forget,  
the big hand is  
the minute hand  
and the small  
hand is the hour  
hand.**

1. Click on the link above
2. Choose the first clock to practice telling time to the hour
3. Read the directions at the top of the screen. (or have an adult help)
4. If there is a digital clock, use the arrows to make the clock say the correct time and watch the hands move on the analog clock

6. If it has just an analog clock, click on the small hand and move it to the correct number.
