to Participate in the Kansas City Kids' Marathon

We are pleased to announce Little Blue Elementary School's participation in the 2014 Kansas City Kids' Marathon. Throughout this 8-week program, students will record miles walked and/or ran during physical education classes, recess and voluntary participation in a Friday morning running club. Our goal is for each Little Blue student to run or walk 25 miles leading up to the final 1.2-mile KC Kids' Marathon. Upon completion of the program, student mileage will total a full marathon! By reaching this goal, our students will complete over 5,000 miles this fall in support of Children's Mercy Hospital's efforts in fighting childhood obesity!

The culminating event in the program is for our students to participate in the 2014 Kansas City Kids' Marathon held on Saturday, October 18th near Crown Center. Through their participation, students will receive a t-shirt and medal from the Kansas City Marathon for their hard work and effort. We are very excited for our students to have this opportunity to participate in this free-of-charge program to help support an active and healthy lifestyle. Students will learn more about this program in their physical education class and information will also be sent home.

The 1st Mile Kick-Off Event-August 28th, 6:30pm

Join us for a family evening event as we kick-off our Kansas City Kids' Marathon effort. Families are encouraged to join us on our Little Blue walking trail to complete the first mile of their marathon journey. After your mile, celebrate with a free smoothie from *Smoothie Factory*.

Friday Morning Running Club Begins August 29th

In conjunction with the Kansas City Kids' Marathon training program, we would like to offer students the opportunity to participate in a before-school Friday morning running club. You and your student(s) are invited to join staff and friends each Friday morning leading up to the KC Kids' Marathon. Your student may be dropped off at the Little Blue walking trail beginning at 8:30 a.m. to complete miles towards reaching his/her goal of 25 miles prior to the Oct. 18th event. Students will be supervised by staff from 8:30-9:00 a.m. and will then be dismissed from the trail to enter into the building for the school day. The first running club will be held on Friday, August 29th!

Importance of School Attendance

We are striving to reach an attendance goal of 97% overall student attendance with 93.6% or more of our students having 90% or greater attendance this school year. In order to reach these goals we will need everyone's support. Below are just a few facts regarding student attendance and some tips for how you can support great attendance with your child daily!

Facts About Attendance:

- Students who attend school regularly learn more and are more successful in school than students who do not. Students who are frequently absent fall behind in academics and miss important socialization concepts that enhance their ability to understand and follow directions or, ultimately, plan for the future.
- Absenteeism hurts the school and district. State financial support for schools is directly linked to student attendance. When students are absent the school loses money.

How Parents Can Help:

- ensure that pupils arrive punctually to school each day
- avoid taking family vacations during the school days
- schedule doctor appointments after-school, if this is not possible schedule them in the early morning or late afternoon to avoid missing as much school as possible
- make time to encourage and show interest in school
- attend school events and functions
- don't let your child miss school without a good reason
- create consistent routines for your child

The Impact of Lost Learning

90% student attendance equals 17.5 days or 3½ weeks of missed school each year! During the course of a student's K-12 career, this would mean 227.5 days of missed school or 1.3 years of lost education!

Transporting Our Future

The safety of all students riding the bus to and from school is a responsibility **we all** share. It takes all of us working together, the students, parents, bus drivers and school officials to ensure safety. To assist us in our task of ensuring all our students are transported in the safest environment possible, the District has established the rules of student conduct listed below.

STEPS TO A SAFE RIDE

- 1. Follow the bus driver's directions.
- 2. Be at the bus stop 5 minutes before and stay at least 5 minutes after your stop time.
- 3. Line up in a single line at the side of the road, no pushing or shoving.
- 4. Sit on your seat, not on knees or backpack.
- 5. Speak quietly to each other.
- 6. Keep hands, feet and other items to yourself on the bus.
- 7. No food, drinks, gum and/or candy on the bus.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

- Students are expected to help keep the bus clean and not purposely or carelessly destroy transportation equipment.
- Damage resulting from misbehavior shall be paid for by the student. Suspension from the bus will occur and continue until all damage is paid for.
- Students will show consideration for other students and the bus driver by being courteous and well-mannered. No profanity or other abusive language.

BUS ASSIGNMENT AND STOPS

- All students must ride to school and home on their regularly assigned bus.
- Any point of pick-up or departure different from the home must be approved by the principal.
- Drivers will not transport any person not regularly assigned to the bus without prior authorization.



AHERA NOTIFICATION

The school district of Independence, MO has completed the removal of friable asbestos in all district school buildings. In addition, all facilities have now been inspected by a certified asbestos inspector as required under the ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY ACT OF 1986 (AHERA). A copy of the AHERA plan has been filed with the State of Missouri and a copy is on file with each building administrator.

The AHERA plan is available for inspection during regular school hours. Specific questions may be directed to your building principal or you may contact the director of the district facilities department at (816) 521-5330.





CHARACTERplus is a program adopted by the Independence School District in 2008. The purpose of the CHARACTERplus is to emphasize positive character traits in all areas of a student's life. In 2008, parents, community members, teachers and counselors gathered together to determine "traits of the month" that they believe reinforce the positive character traits already taught in many homes.

The traits are blended into the curriculum, extracurricular activities, and are displayed throughout the community. The Independence School District believes that modeling character traits may be the most effective way of passing them on to students. Ambition is having strong determination to accomplish goals.






Join Little Blue Elementary As We Kick-Off the Kansas City Kids' Marathon

Keeping Our Sharks Safe

It Takes Each of Us!

Little Blue Elementary welcomes visitors to our school community as we are very proud of our facilities and our learning environment. However, keeping our Sharks safe is our top priority at Little Blue and within the Independence School District. Please review the below information regarding some of our practices, our routines and the ways that you may help us reach this goal on a daily basis!

A Secure Building: All exterior doors at Little Blue are locked when students are in attendance. For any visitor to gain access to the building, the buzzer system located at the front door of the school must be used. Office staff will greet visitors through the intercom system and will ask the visitor to provide information regarding his her visit. At this time, all unknown visitors will be asked to provide a government issued photo I.D. Office staff will determine if entry to the school will be granted. Once entry to the school has been provided, please note the below expectations of our visitors.

- Once inside the building, please proceed to the office to sign our Guest Log.
- · Visitors will be required to wear a visitor badge provided by the office during their visit.
- A request to visit a classroom can only be approved by the principal, but is not encouraged due to interruption of the learning environment.

In an effort to keep our schools as secure as possible, all ISD schools will be asking parents to not excert their children to the classroom beginning Monday, August 18th. Instead, please leave your child at the car rider door if you choose to walk them to the building instead of utilizing our car rider drop off. If you feel your child is having difficulty transitioning to school in the morning, we are happy and more than willing to assist! Often times we have found, especially for our youngest students, that returning after the first few weekends can be a challenge. We are ready to help!

Arrival and Dismissal: Following Little Blue's arrival and dismissal procedures helps to promote the safe movement of students before and after our school day. These procedures also support the Little Blue staff in the safe transition of students from our care to the care of parents. We ask that parents remain in vehicles during drop-off and arrival as staff will support your child in and out of your vehicle. Car rider arrival will begin at 8:45am and will conclude at 9:00am. For the safety of our students, we ask that parents do not drop off your child without staff present. During times of high traffic flow in our car rider loop, we understand this process may be slowed. We feel the extra few minutes these procedures may take are worth the extra effort in keeping our Sharks safe. A more-detailed explanation of arrival and dismissal procedures can be found on our Little Blue website.

Being Prepared: Little Blue Elementary and all ISD schools have safety and crisis plans in place in case of an emergency. In addition, students and staff participate in routine drills throughout the school year. We are also fortunate to have the great support of our local emergency responders throughout our community.

Ensuring the Safety of Our Sharks is a Group Effort: Through the course of the school year we want each of our students and families to be aware of our school surroundings. If you ever see suspicious activity around our school or any of our ISD schools, please report it immediately.
