

Importance of School Attendance

We are striving to reach an attendance goal of 97% overall student attendance with 93.6% or more of our students having 90% or greater attendance this school year. In order to reach these goals we will need everyone's support. Below are just a few facts regarding student attendance and some tips for how you can support great attendance with your child daily!

Little Blue's October Attendance

Total Enrollment: 269 Sharks Average Daily Attendance: 96.58%

Percentage of Students at 90% or Greater Attendance Percentage: 94.35%

Research has proven that there is a high correlation between school attendance and academic performance and success, while absence from school is often the greatest single cause of poor performance and achievement.

Why is it so Important to attend every day?

• Learning is a progressive activity; each day's lessons build upon those of the previous day(s).

• Reading the material and completing work independently does not compensate for the loss of insight gained during class discussion or the loss of competency acquired through explanation or supervised drill.

• Many classes use lectures, discussions, demonstrations, experiments and participation as part of the daily learning activities, and these cannot be made up by those who are absent.

The Impact of Lost Learning

90% student attendance equals 17.5 days or 3 ¹/₂ weeks of missed school each year! During the course of a student's K-12 career, this would mean 227.5 days of missed school or 1.3 years of lost education!



ENUF Highlights Anti-Bullying Message

The ENUF Stop bullying team from William Chrisman joined Little Blue students this week to share a vibrant interactive musical antibullying program with our Sharks! The program consisted of a selection of musical vignettes and discussions with our students. ENUF is under the umbrella of the Association for Chrisman Excellence (ACE) Club and is in its 10th year of production and is an excellent way to support our CharacterPlus initiative at Little Blue. Our students responded in a very positive way to the high school role models who have worked hard to make this a quality experience for our students. **ENUF Stop Bullying** is an excellent counter to the media messages of what is OK behavior since this program is built on virtues, character traits, and habits which we need to carefully nurture in our young people.
