This painting has two people in it. A man and a woman. Notice some of the features of the face are from a profile view and some are on a face on view.

Profile: eyes, ear, nose, eye brows, chin

Face on: lips, nostrils

Picasso said once that he did this because he was motivated by what he felt not what he saw.

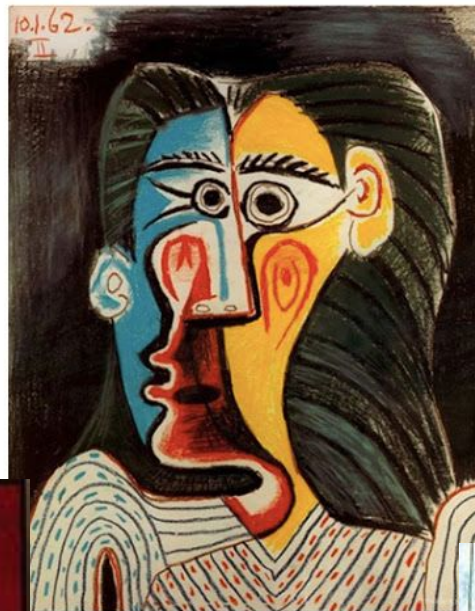
Others believe it was so that he could educate his audience on his personal views about different people.

Some are Picasso's others are inspired from him.

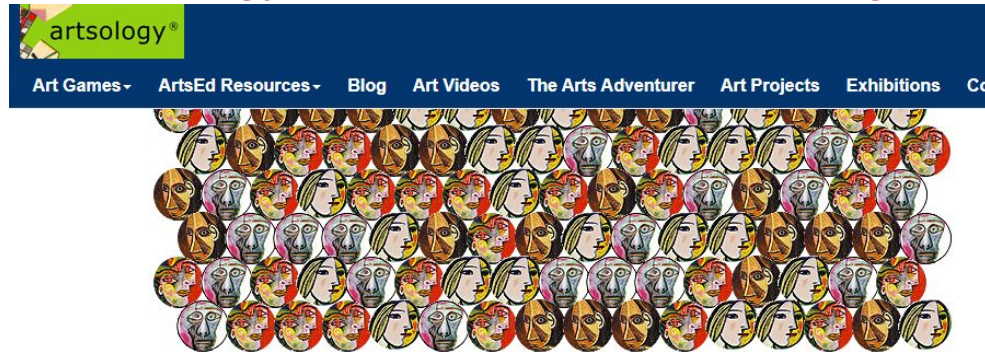
