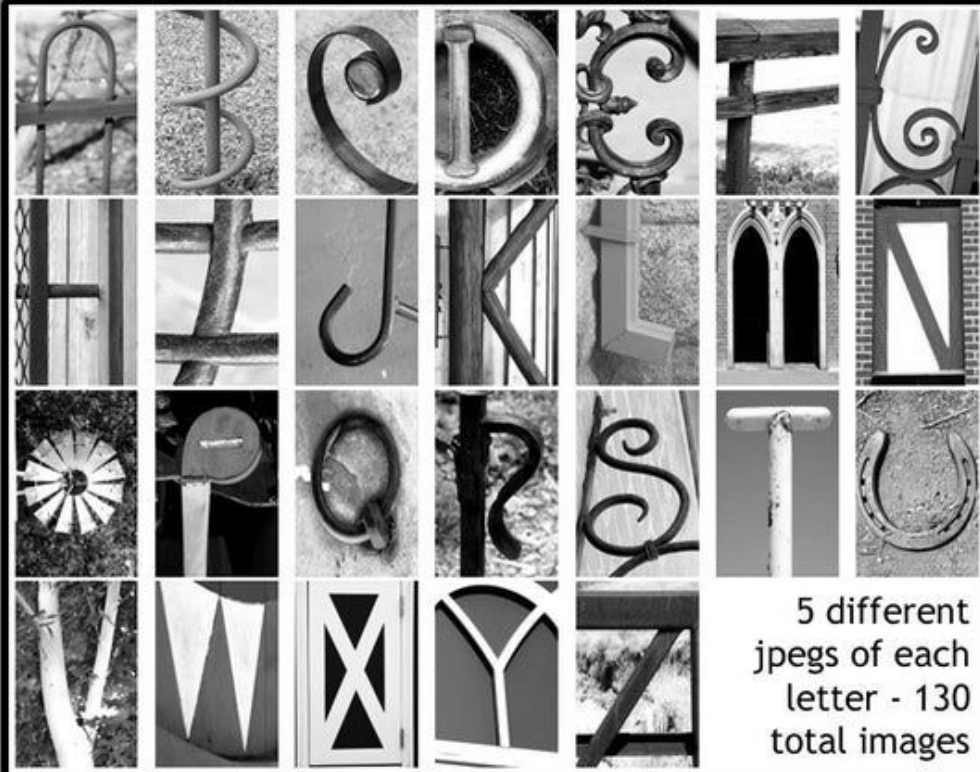

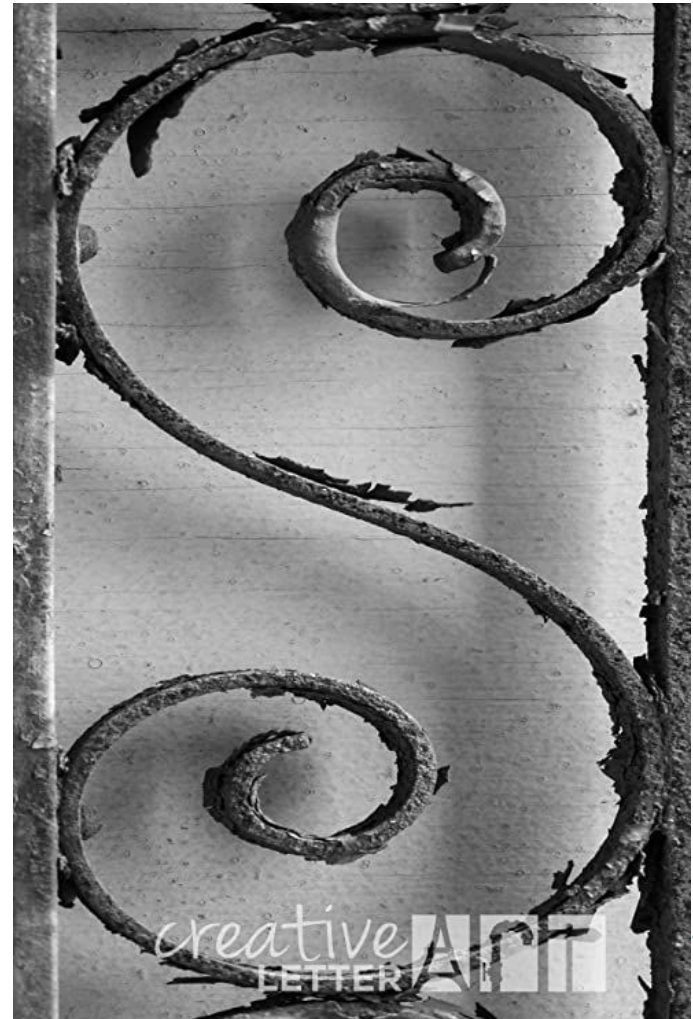
Alphabet Scavenger Hunt!



What you will need:

- Digital camera or phone
- Chromebook or computer
- Alphabet checklist

I'd like you to try and find every letter in the alphabet. I know some letters might be difficult. Remember you can form a letter with anything. Sticks, flowers, toys etc. Take a picture of it with your phone, camera, or Chromebook. I know using your Chromebook will be difficult. Just try your best.



After you take your photos, if you're using a camera or phone you'll need to email yourself the photos. If you have a camera, you'll need download them to your computer then email them. As you save them to your computer or Chromebook make sure to save the jpeg as the letter it is. That will make it easier to find.


Start thinking of a word you'd like to create with your letters. Although I'd like you to find every letter in the alphabet, I really want you to focus on the letters of your selected word.
