Objective/Learning Target: We will be taking a closer look at the artist Kandinsky.

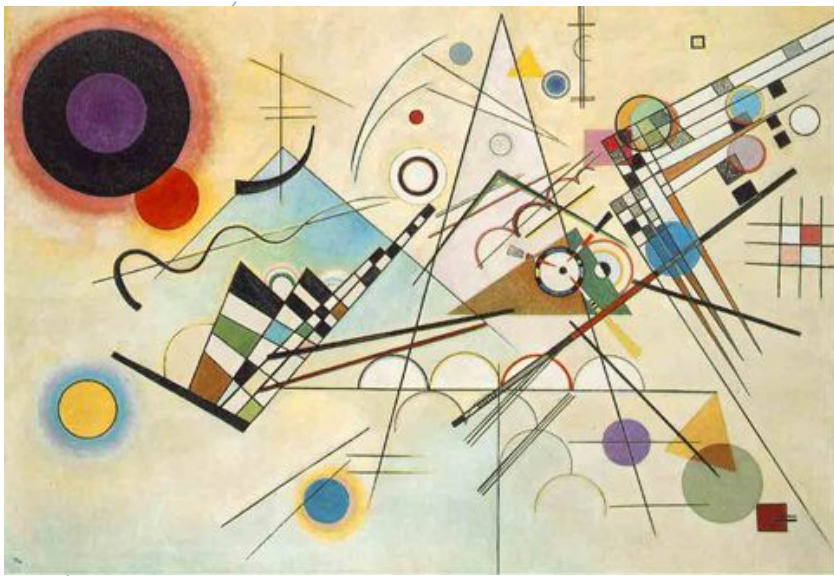

Who was Wassily Kandinsky?



Wassily Wassilyevich Kandinsky (16 December 1866 – 13 December 1944) was a Russian painter and art theorist.

In Germany, he taught at the Bauhaus school of art and architecture from 1922 until the Nazis closed it in 1933 and then he moved again, now to France, where he lived for the rest of his life and where he produced some of his most prominent art.

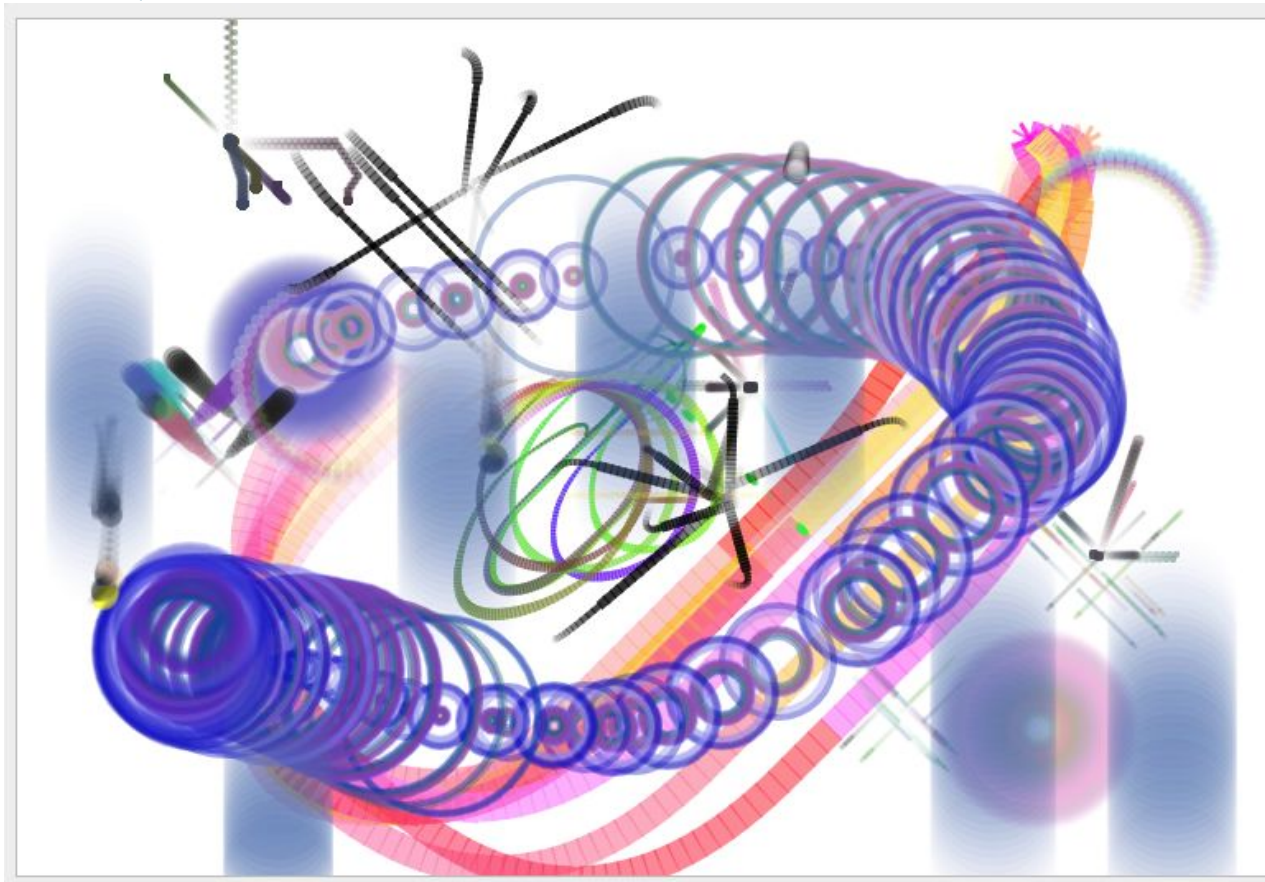
What about these two paintings? What do you see?




Kandinsky often listened to classical music while painting. His favorite music was from Richard Wagner.
