Abstract Art

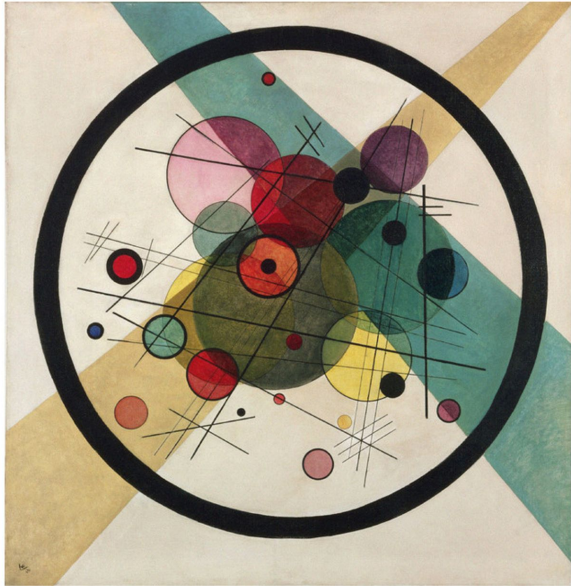
is modern art which does not represent images of our everyday world. It has color, lines and shapes, but they are not intended to represent objects or living things.

- He used color

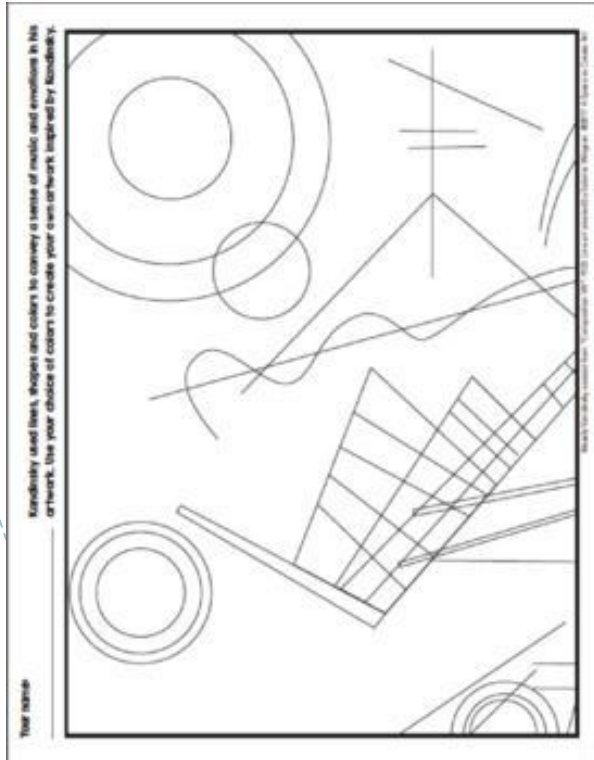
To day we will create a drawing inspired by Kandinsky!



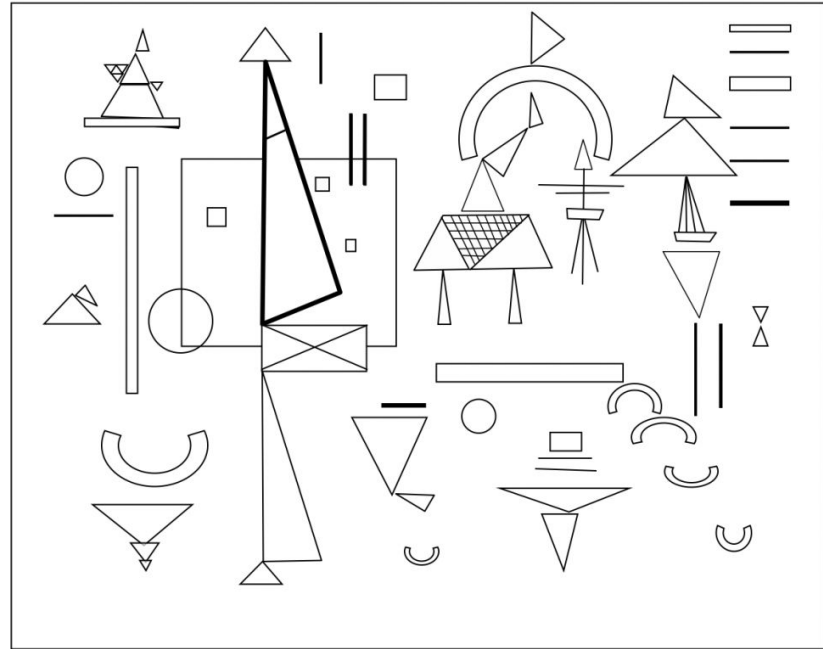
I'd like you to google Kandinsky. Find a painting that speaks to you. I'd like you to try and replicate it. This one is called *Circles in a Circle*. I really like this one. I like the mixture of circles and straight lines contained in the bigger circle, which works as a frame for them. Who knew something so simple to draw could make beautiful art?


You'll need:
