- He used color


To day we will create a drawing inspired by Kandinsky!




I'd like you to google Kandinsky. Find a painting that speaks to you. I'd like you to try and replicate it. This one is called Circles in a Circle. I really like this one. I like the mixture of circles and straight lines contained in the bigger circle, which works as a frame for them. Who knew something so simple to draw could make beautiful art?

You'll need:

Paper, pencil, circular things to trace and a ruler. Below are some examples of Kandinsky's shapes and lines.
