is modern art which does not


represent images of our

Argentinian artist Elian Chali, who goes by just his first name professionally, creates vibrant murals that balance a simple aesthetic with carefully calculated designs. Elian's work is abstract because it does not represent anything. His squiggles and squares overlap each other. His clean lines and flat color fields almost seem to be rendered digitally rather than hand-painted. But what makes him very unique is his canvas. Buildings and walls. Yes, he hand paints hundreds of square feet to achieve his artwork. In addition to his mural projects, the self-taught artist creates smaller gallery-ready paintings and prints, and also works as a freelance curator.
