







Lesson: April 14

Objective/Learning Target I can shade and add form using only line rather than blending my pencil.





You may recall some of these techniques from art class throughout the years. Maybe you already use one and didn't realize it was an actual technique artists use. How many of these do you recognize?





Today, we are going to explore cross hatching.

In this image, the artist uses the thickness and spacing of lines to create shading in his artwork fist. Igor Lukyanov- Graphic artist





The thicker and closer the lines are, the darker the value becomes. The most highlighted areas have very few lines, or no lines at all.

So how do we use lines to create form as well as value?


Let's keep using this hand. Are the lines all going the same way? No. They curve to give the viewer the illusion of form and the feel of the hand. Igor Lukyanov- Graphic artist





When we bend and curve our cross-hatching around our object, we call this CROSS-CONTOUR.

This helps to create form.







PRACTICE VIDEO



- Find an object with different types of edges (round, flat, sharp) to draw. DO NOT SHADE IT BY BLENDING YOUR PENCIL. Shade using line. By CROSSHATCHING.
- Looking at the example on this slide, note how the lines are straight on the flat sides and curved on the handles. Be sure your own shading creates the illusion you need !
