

# May 18 Objective/Learning Target

I can study the *Mona Lisa* and practice seeing an image from another persons point of view.





We are going to spend this week diving into the history and mysteries of the *Mona Lisa*. Heard of her? She is a very famous, recognizable painting. Songs, poems, and parodies have been made after her. But, how much do we really know about her?

Include key features of this painting and use your academic vocabulary. (Principals and Elements) You get to pick the point of view. Next, is a list of people to choose from whose lives have been changed because of this painting.

Madam Lisa Gioconda- the possible model for this painting.

The thief Vincenzo Perugia who stole her to return her to what he saw as her rightful home, Italy.

Andy Warhol- artist who was inspired by this paintings when he created *Marilyn*.
