

Andy Warhol was an artist around 450 years after Leonardo Da Vinci. He knew his Pop culture well; the current popular celebrities and items of his time. He used them for his art. But he also knew his history. Have you seen this artwork?






Warhol also did his own version by printing the Mona Lisa in Warhol Screen print style...





This artwork seems radically different from the subtle earth tones of our Mona Lisa. What could they possible have in common? Take a moment and create a Venn Diagram with a circle for each artwork and the middle being what they have in common.
